### Research

We are participating in two pieces of research work throughout the summer.

**Visitor Survey 2018** – this is research we have commissioned on visitors to Thanet that will be carried out in Margate, Broadstairs and Ramsgate between now and the end of October. This piece of work aims to measure the changes in visitor numbers, visitor motivations and visitor profile since the last face-to-face visitor survey in 2010 and to help measure the impact of the Destination Management Plan (DMP).

**Cambridge Model Economic Impact Study 2017** – we carry out this research every two years through Visit Kent. This research shows the volume and value of tourism to the area and the number of jobs which it supports. The data is also broken down to show day visits, overnight stays, type of accommodation, etc.

For both pieces of research we will have the opportunity to input wider Thanet information, which will help with the robustness of the report. This includes local information such as retail footfall, student data, car park numbers and the data collected as part of Visit Kent's Business Barometer.
